One item that we have overlooked but do not plan on overlooking this year is the obvious references to what club they are. We have had to read through the entries with much redacting done to keep the entry to the directions. Another area that the committee will not overlook this year is when the directions specify a number of items to be listed and explained, ie. "describe ONE project that was completed this year." What we are given is multiple projects. We think the clubs who list this are very active and have great projects, but to be fair to those clubs who adhere to the direction, this is not fair. We do discern between answers to questions similar to this between multiple projects and projects with multiple parts. In January, North Allegheny Interact held a "Five InterActs of Kindness Week." Each day from Jan 23-27, we engaged in a small act of kindness to honor the Rotary's pillars. Students brought refillable water bottles to school and learned what they could do to protect the environment and water supply. We wrote welcoming postcards to refugees coming to Pittsburgh, unlocking \$4,755 in donations to charitable organizations supporting refugee aid. Students showed gratitude to parents, caregivers, and teachers! Finally, we participated in a Dollar Drive; a donation of \$873 Build-a-Chair, sent to а non-profit was organization that builds wheelchairs for people with disabilities in Tanzania.

In February, we made origami heart bouquets with encouraging notes to show our appreciation for our school librarians, nurses, and secretaries for Valentine's Day. Additionally, we had some members compete in (and win!) the District 7305 Interact Trivia Competition, earning \$500 for our club to use toward a service project of our choice. Some of our students also judged our school district's middle school writing competition, reading and evaluating entries in three different categories -- Poetry, Flash Fiction, and 6-Word Story.















At the middle schools, EarlyAct clubs wrote encouraging "Post-It Notes of Kindness" and placed them on student lockers, writing almost 1400 notes! Additionally, some Early Actors have been selected to serve on "Leadership Councils" at their respective middle schools to gain leadership skills while getting hands-on experience in planning EarlyAct meetings, announcing events and news, and working and communicating with a team.
